The reason critical illness insurance is so important is other types of insurance simply aren't designed to meet the additional expenses of a serious illness or condition. - Travel expenses to and from treatment
- Out-of-network doctors and hospitals
- Childcare and eldercare
- Insurance deductibles and co-payments
